## Duties and Responsibilities

## Members

Each member is expected to serve on at least one REFRESHMENT COMMITTEE during the year as a hostess. An exception is granted to each associate member. DUE TO A LIMITED NUMBER OF MEMBERS, you may be asked to serve more than once a year.

## Dues

Your membership fee is due at the April meeting. The treasurer should receive your payment no later than May 30 for your name to be included in the membership list for the coming year.

## Special Project Chairmen

The chairmen of special projects (fashion show, Christmas parade, teachers' lunch), should meet with their committees well in advance of the event to plan ads; posters, refreshments, prizes, tickets, etc. All newspaper

publicity should be given to the Publicity Chairman as early as possible (no later than two weeks before the event).
The chairman must announce the event to the membership. She is responsible, if necessary, for selling tickets to the members and the general public.
NOTE: Volunteering to serve for SPECIAL PROJECTS is a service in addition to being on a program committee.
It is vital to our club that we have a working membership. We need everyone.

## Program Chaimen

The chairman of each monthly general meeting is in charge of having a speaker or performance that relates to her chair. She should meet with her committee about 2 weeks prior to the event to decide on refreshments and check on supplies.
If the chairman wishes to appoint a head hostess from her committee, she may do so, always remembering it is still her responsibility to see that everything is "under control."
She should give the Publicity Chairman information about her meeting well in advance of the meeting. The Publicity Chairman must send the information to the newspapers no later than 2 weeks ahead of the publication date.
She should also call the Chairman of the Telephone Committee and tell her the same information that she gives to the Publicity Chairman.

## Chaimen and Hostess Duties

On the day of the function, the chairman and her hostesses must come early to the hall to decorate and prepare for serving refreshments. The hostesses provide food, plates, utensils, napkins, and table centerpieces.

## (Chairmen \& Hostesses Continued)

The program chairman or hostesses should check ahead of time for supplies. The VIA cupboard contains tablecloths and some supplies and should always be checked well in advance. General supplies (coffee, tea, sugar) are handled by the Supplies Chairman; cream is supplied by the hostesses.

Keep your costs under control; be kind to your hostess committee's finances. The entire refreshment committee (including program chairman) should remain for cleanup. In the event of a large club function, a dishwasher may be hired. Check with the president to be certain of the amount of money the board allows for hiring a dishwasher.

Do not clean up while a program is in progress. We will appear rude to the speaker. It is often best for guest speakers to give their programs before we serve refreshments, thus alleviating this problem.
The committee must dry, stack, and put away any dishes used. If any member cannot assume the assigned hostess duty, as listed in this booklet as "Chairmen and Hostess Duties", it is the chairman's responsibility to find a replacement.
The tablecloths are to be taken home, cleaned, and returned before the next function. The president, or her designee, is responsible for final lock up.

## Activity Chaimen

If a special activity is planned, the chairman is responsible for arranging a meeting place, and a refreshment hostess, if appropriate. Members are asked to call or sign up so the chairman and hostess can complete their plans for the meeting. The president or her designee is responsible for locking up.

## By Laws

## Article I: Name

Section 1. The name of the club shall be Village Improvement Association Orange City Woman’s Club, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the Club .

Section 2. This club is a member of the constituent division of the GFWC Florida Federation of Women's Clubs and the General Federation of Women's Clubs, with the privilege of representation in the meetings of these organizations and shall be responsible for the payment of per capita as provided by the bylaws of each Federation.

## Artic le II: Object

The object of the Orange City Woman’s Club shall be to unite women, to promote their common interest in charitable and educational purposes, to operate exclusively within the meaning of Sec. 501c(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, and to otherwise comply with any requirements for classification as an exempt organization under such section.

## Artic le III Dissolution

In case this corporation wishes to dissolve and by due process of law shall dissolve, all assets of whatever nature, or their equivalent in value, which remain after the just debts and
liabilities of this corporation have been satisfied, shall be used for such educational or public purpose or purposes, within the State of Florida, as will complete or continue undertakings for the public benefit, already begun by the Club, and any remaining assets shall be distributed for purpose or purposes within the scope of Internal

Revenue Service 501c(3). No part of the net income or earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any

individual member or be distributed to its members or officers.

## Artic le IV: Membership

Section 1. Any woman resident of the community who is interested in the object of this club is eligible for membership, providing a member in good standing has extended an invitation to attend two but not more than four general meetings as a guest before she declares her intentions to join. The sponsoring member shall present an application with the prospective name to the membership chairman who shall in turn present the name to the president. The prospective member shall attend a meeting of orientation held by either, or both, the membership chairman and the president. The president shall notify the board of the new member who shall be eligible to pay the annual dues and shall be inducted into the Club with the attendance of the sponsor at the next installation ceremony.
Section 2. There shall be four classes of membership: Active, Inactive Associate, Life Member, and Honorary Life Member.

1. Active Membership shall include all privileges of membership in the District VI GFWC Florida Federation, and the General Federation of Women's Clubs, as provided by the bylaws of each organization. They shall have the right to vote, hold office, and shall be responsible for carrying on the work of the Club.
2. Inactive Associate shall be a member of at least two years standing who is no longer able to carry the full responsibilities of membership. Upon request, the Board shall approve by a majority vote.
This category of membership shall include: payment of dues

set in the Standing Rules and entitles the member to all privileges of Active Membership. Additional qualifications may appear in the Rules.
3. Life Membership shall be granted to those who elect to endow the Club with a payment as set in the Rules. Such members shall have the privilege of membership without further payment of dues.
4. Honorary Membership may be bestowed by the simple majority vote of the Board on any person who has served the Club with distinction; who is no longer able to enjoy the activities of the Club (for example, lives in a nursing home or has moved from our immediate area); or who desires to become part of the VIA Orange City Woman's Club, while maintaining membership in another federated Woman's Club. No dues shall be paid and membership shall be recognized locally only. Additional qualifications may appear in the Rules.
5. A former member may be reinstated by the payment of current dues.

Section 3. Termination may be by:

1. Written request to the Board by the member,
2. Non-payment of dues 30 days after notification by the Treasurer, or
3. A $2 / 3$ vote of the Board for behavioral circumstances that could be detrimental to the purpose of the Club and contrary to its Collect.

## Article V: Dues

Section 1. Annual dues shall cover Local, State and National Assessments and shall be set forth in the Standing Rules. Dues must be paid by the date stated in the Rules and shall not be prorated.

## Artic le VI: Meetings

Section 1. The meetings of the club shall be held once a month October through May as set forth in the Rules. Time and date of meeting may be changed by the Executive Board, providing advance notice is given to the membership.
Section 2. The fiscal year shall agree with Club payment of GFWC Florida and GFWC dues.
Section 3. Annual Meeting. The annual meeting shall be held in April and shall be for the purpose of receiving reports of officers and committees, electing officers, and such other business as may arise.
Section 4. Budget. The prepared budget, approved by the Executive Board, shall be presented to the membership for adoption during the April Annual Meeting.
Section 5. A Quorum of the membership shall consist of a majority of Club members.

## Artic le VII: Officers

The officers of this Club shall be: President, $1^{\text {st }}$ VicePresident, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Vice-President, $3^{\text {rd }}$ Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer.

## A. Nominations and Elections

Section 1. The Nominating Committee shall consist of three persons who have been members of the Club for at least one year. One shall be appointed by the President from the Executive Board; one shall be elected from the Executive Board, and one shall be elected from the Club at Large.

## (Bylaws Continued)

Section 2. The Nominating Committee shall prepare a slate of Officers consisting of at least one name for each office. All candidates with the exception of President must have been a member of the Club for at least one year and must give prior consent to their nomination. The President Elect should have served on the Executive Board as an elected official for at least two years within the past four years.

Section 3. The selected slate of officers shall be presented at the March General Meeting. Nominations may be made from the floor. Elections shall take place at the April General Meeting. Installation shall take place at the May General Meeting.

Section 4. Election shall be by ballot except where there is only one name for each office, then the Secretary shall cast the unanimous ballot.

## B. Term of Office

Section 1. The term of office for all officers shall be two years, with each officer serving until her successor is elected. An officer may serve in the same office for a consecutive term. An officer having served the major portion of a term shall be considered to have a served a full term.

Section 2. A vacancy in any elected office shall be filled by the Executive Board for the unexpired term, except the Office of President (which shall be filled by the $1^{\text {st }}$ Vice-President, or descending Vice-Presidents), the office of Recording Secretary (which shall be filled by the Assistant Recording Secretary), and the office of Treasurer (which shall be filled by the Assistant Treasurer).

## C. Duties

Section 1. The President shall be the official representative of the Club to the GFWC Florida and the GFWC and shall see that all Federation information is presented to the Club. She shall preside at all meetings of the Club and the Executive Board; shall be ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating committee; shall appoint all necessary committees and Heads of Program Service Areas, which are necessary to conduct the work of the Club.
Section 2. The $1^{\text {st }}$ Vice-President shall perform all duties of the President in her absence; understudy the work of that office; shall be Chairman of the Program Committee; and shall perform other duties that may be assigned to her.
Section 3. The $2^{\text {nd }}$ Vice-President shall perform all duties of the President and $1^{\text {st }}$ Vice-President in their absence, understudy the work of their offices and shall be Publicity Chairman, keep the Press Book, and keep current History Records.
Section 4. The $3^{\text {rd }}$ Vice-President shall perform all duties of the President , $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ Vice-Presidents in their absence, understudy the work of their offices and shall be Membership Chairman and New Member Counselor.
Section 5. The Recording Secretary shall write and keep accurate Minutes of the General Meetings and Executive Board Meetings and shall deliver all Secretary's books and records in her custody to her successor within one month after her term expires.
Section 6. The Assistant Recording Secretary shall assume the responsibility of the Recording Secretary in her absence.

## (Bylaws Continued)

Section 7. The Corresponding Secretary shall assist the President with the official correspondence of the Club; send our activities and news to District VI Clubs, furnish the District and State Federation with a list of the Club Officers immediately after the election; send the name of the President to GFWC Florida Headquarters and to the General Federation of Women's Clubs Headquarters.

Section 8. The Treasurer shall be custodian of all Club funds; disburse funds only upon order of the Executive Board; keep a record of all receipts and disbursements; submit a written report at the General Meeting and Executive Board Meeting; shall deliver all records in her possession to her successor within one month after her term expires; and shall deliver her books for Audit upon request.

Section 9. The Assistant Treasurer shall assist the Treasurer with Financial responsibilities of the Club, and assume responsibilities of the Treasurer in her absence.

Section 10. All officers should attempt to attend all District VI Meetings to complement our Club’s voting strength.

## Article VIII Appointed Offic ers, Program Service Areas, and Standing Committees

Section 1. Appointed Officers shall be:

Section 2. Program Service Areas shall be:
Arts and Crafts Home Life
Literature and Music International Affairs
Conservation Public Affairs
Education
Program Service Areas (PSA) Chairmen shall plan Programs for the General Meeting under the direction of the Program Chairman ( $1^{\text {st }}$ Vice-President). The PSA committees may enter into any projects with the approval of the Board. All funds raised must be paid into the Treasury.
Section 3. Standing Committees are appointed by the President with the approval of the Executive Board. They shall give reports to the Board as requested.

## Artic le IX: Executive Board

Section 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the Elected Officers, Appointed Officers, PSA Chairmen, Counselor(s), and the Immediate Past-President.

Section 2. Regular meetings of the Executive Board shall be held once a month preceding the general meeting, and special meetings may be called by the President.

Section 3. The Executive Board shall manage the affairs of the Club, fill vacancies in office; and determine the disposition of Club funds, with approval of the Membership; present all recommendations to the Club Members for approval; and perform such other duties as may be authorized by the Club.

Section 4. A Quorum of the Executive Board shall consist of a majority of the Executive Board members.

## (Bylaws Continued)

## Article X: Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Club in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and any special rules of order the Club may adopt.

## Artic le XI: Amendments

These Bylaws may be amended at any meeting by a twothirds vote of the members present and voting, provided the amendments have been approved by the Executive Board and submitted to the membership at a previous meeting. Proposed amendments to the Bylaws without previous notice shall require a unanimous vote.
